

How our budget breaks down

The purpose of this document is to give a summary of the major expense elements of an annual budget. Our church represents several generations of faithfulness to the Mission of the Gospel and our mission: to "**Rooted** in God's grace, growing through spiritual understanding to **know**, **love** and **serve** Christ.". The chart below shows our budget in terms of how your giving supports the ministries of First Presbyterian. We are grateful for those who came before us, building this church and making it what it is today. We are called to commit our own talents, time and treasure to be God's church today, and to ensure that the generations after us will be able to carry it forward.



*in 2016 you also gave \$37,000 towards mission through Challenge Offerings and 2017 will likely be close to the same which makes our Mission giving 15% of all income.

However, Jesus then invested in his disciples, loving them, teaching them and giving them experiences that helped them to grow into the leaders they became. We are fortunate to have capable staff who find creative ways to teach our children, youth, families, and adults of all ages. In addition, we stepped out in faith to increase our investment in our adult ministries, extending beyond a classroom and offering more experiential opportunities like outdoor adventures and yoga. We also continue to offer spiritual retreats. This year we hope to have a group go to Ghost Ranch for a week long retreat. First Presbyterian has always valued the growth mindset. Being a church that allows people to change and grow has been a breath of fresh air for many.



LOVE

CONGREGATIONAL CARE

2018 \$46,800 (estimated)

In the last 4 years we have invested in leadership for congregational care and have seen a wonderful and very loving



visitation ministry expand and grow so that all our congregants will know that they are loved and considered part of our community. Additionally, we have begun helping those with limitations that lead to them being excluded from many activities, go on day trips and adventures. Visitors check the the hospital every day and communion is brought to those unable to come to church. We also offer care and opportunities for people going through every sort of life transition. It's never easy to say goodbye to our loved ones and we are able to provide compassionate care and services to families who are grieving. It's important that memorial services celebrate the lives of those we love.

SERVE

MISSION

2018 \$58,500 (estimated)

Just as each of us must consider what portion

of our income we give to the ministry of the Gospel, we as a church also want to give outwardly. We do this through supporting the work of the Presbytery and other Presbyterian ministries both internationally and locally through our partnership giving. We also support WestM United Campus Ministries and with the Pastoral Counseling Center with budgeted giving. What is not reflected in our budget is the generosity you show above our budget through giving to challenge offerings. In reality we give close to \$40,000 more to various organizations, local and international. This increases our percentage of giving from income to around 15%. We also house and support a preschool which has a nearly \$700,000 annual budget and serves many in the community.





ADMINISTRATION AND COMMUNICATIONS

2018 \$105,300 (estimated)

The administration of a church our size, with a preschool and constant activities is a ministry. Almost all staff are involved in administration in some form but our office staff faithfully serve this church daily, ensuring efficient operation and good stewardship of First Presbyterian resources. In addition, communication is vital to our church and the publication of newsletters, bulletins, emails and other materials help keep everyone in the know.

FACILITY MAINTENANCE 2018 \$152,100 (estimated)

Our sanctuary is a historic treasure and the subsequent editions over the generations have all been built to serve the needs of the church and community. Costs are going up. Electricity alone costs over \$20,000 a year. The cost of owning, repairing, and preserving a historic building can be daunting but it is part of our calling to honor what others have



done before us and to be able to hand it off to future generations in great shape. The wider community benefits from our facility as we host many groups and activities.

BEYOND BUDGET

The Challenge offerings are not the only way people give beyond the budget. In 2017 we also received:

- An Anonymous gift of \$100,000 to purchase a Steinway B piano. This has already resulted in more community music events being scheduled at our church.
- Gifts in excess of \$40,000 to restore our historic Povey Windows. In the last 4 years over \$100,000 has been given/raised towards restoring the four large windows in our sanctuary. We still have many smaller windows to go but we are very close to having completed all of the 4 main windows.
- With Sharon Fries' permission, I can tell you that this year, as Lyle Fries faced his diagnosis of terminal cancer, they wanted to be able to do something that would assist this church for generations. They did just that by paying the \$191,000 mortgage remaining from the Dennis Hall project. This put over \$12,000 a year, for the next 16 years, back into our general budget. I am glad that Lyle was able to see the real impact that this had in enabling us to expand our ministries and enable us, along with funds from the endowment, to have a 75% time Stated Supply Associate Pastor. Estate and other gifts to the endowment also build stability for the church, and her future, and we will focus on this type of planned giving in the Spring.
