The special meeting was called by moderator Commissioned Pastor Beulah Nowpakahok with the concurrence of Rev. Piper Cartland, Rev. Curt Karns, elder Dale Berry (Eagle River PC) and elder Bob Christensen (First Wasilla PC), to act on business identified in the call to the meeting (Appendix A):

• Vote to guarantee/co-sign a disaster relief loan for Eagle River PC

Eagle River elder Dale Berry spoke on behalf of the Eagle River Presbyterian Church which sustained considerable damage from the November 30, 2018 earthquake. Church trustees have applied for grant assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency and a loan from the Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program (PILP) to help pay for repair costs.

The church is seeking a \$195,800 loan from PILP, with a 15-20 year payback period. A PILP disaster relief loan carries a low 1.75% interest rate. On behalf of the Stewardship Committee, committee moderator Bob Christensen reported that the committee has reviewed the loan application and recommends that presbytery approve the request and to guarantee/co-sign the loan and assume repayment responsibility in the event of loan default. Motion was **APPROVED**.

If PILP approves the loan, the church property, located at 12836 Old Glenn Hwy and with a legal description of Block B Lot 1B Debora Subdivision, will serve as collateral.

Curt Karns reported that the one-year contract is the same as last year's, except that dates reflect the new contract period. The contract was **APPROVED** as presented (Appendix B).



The meeting has been called by moderator Commissioned Pastor Beulah Nowpakahok with the concurrence of Rev. Piper Cartland, Rev. • Vote on whether to guarantee/co-sign a disaster relief loan from the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Investment and Loan Program (PILP) for Eagle River Presbyterian Church. The church is requesting \$195,800 to repair damage caused by the November 30, 2018 earthquake and a 15-20 year payback period. PILP's disaster relief loans carry a 1.75% interest rate.

If PILP approves the loan, the church property, located at 12836 Old Glenn Hwy, and with a legal description of Block B Lot 1B Debora Subdivision, will serve as collateral.

INTERGENERATIONAL ARCTIC MINISTRIES

CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

THIS CONTRACT is dated as of March 1, **2019**, by and between INTERGENERATIONAL ARCTIC MINISTRIES ("IAM") and PRESBYTERY OF YUKON ("Contractor") (alternatively referred to as a "Party" or collectively as the "Parties"), as follows.

PART I

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. Scope of Services.

Contractor shall be responsible for overseeing the administration, programs, and strategic plan of IAM as well as upholding its mission, vision, and values. Without limitation of the foregoing, Contractor shall:

- A. Work with IAM's board of directors in developing a strategic plan, as well as its mission, vision, values and policies;
- B. Work with all faith-based churches and agencies currently active in regions where IAM works and desiring to participate in this ministry;
- C. Work with the consultant on faith-based programming from the North Slope Borough;
- D. Recruit essential staff for the start-up phase of IAM's work (finance, grant writing, and directors for individual programs); and
- E. Be IAM's visible spokesperson with a unique opportunity to positively influence the community when it comes to supporting IAM and its ministries.

Section 2. Term.

- A. The term of this contract shall be one (1) year commencing on March 1, **2019**.
- B. This contract may be extended for one (1) year option periods upon mutual consent of the Parties.

Section 3. Compensation; Payment.

- A. Subject to Contractor's satisfactory performance, IAM shall pay Contractor FIVE THOUSAND THIRTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$5,035) per month payable on the first day of each month during the term hereof.
- B. In addition, IAM shall reimburse Contractor for the following expenses incurred by Contractor:
 - 1. All travel expenses, including food and lodging, to and from Anchorage, Point Hope, Point Lay and other locations where there are no Presbyterian churches;
 - 2. One-half of all travel expenses, to and from Anchorage, Wainwright, Atqasuk, Utqiaġvik, Nuiqsut, Kaktovik, Anaktuvuk Pass and other locations where there are Presbyterian churches;
 - 3. One-half of all travel expenses to and from Anchorage, Gambell and Savoonga, if IAM obtains funding for work on St. Lawrence Island;
 - 4. Services of an administrative assistant, as needed, at the rate of TWENTY DOLLARS (\$20) per hour; and
 - 5. All other expenses incurred by Contractor within the scope of services described in Part I, Section 1, and approved by the president of IAM's board of directors.

Section 4. Termination of Contractor's Services.

Contractor's services under this contract may be terminated:

- A. By mutual consent of the Parties; or
- B. For the convenience of either Party, provided that the terminating Party notifies the other Party in writing of its intent to terminate under this paragraph at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of termination.

Section 5. Duties Upon Termination.

A. If IAM terminates Contractor's services for convenience, IAM shall pay all compensation payable to Contractor under this contract through the date of termination, together with all costs reasonably incurred prior thereto. All finished and unfinished documents and materials prepared by Contractor pursuant to this contract shall become the property of IAM. B. Except as provided in this section, termination of Contractor's services under Part I, Section 4, does not affect any other right or obligation of a Party under this contract.

Section 6. Insurance.

- A. Contractor shall maintain in good standing, for the entire period of the contact, the insurance described in subsection B of this section. Before rendering any services under this contract, Contractor shall furnish the Administrator with proof of insurance in accordance with subsection B of this section in a form acceptable to IAM.
- B. Contractor shall provide the following insurance:
 - 1. \$500,000 Employers Liability and Worker's Compensation as required by Alaska Law.
 - 2. Commercial Automobile Liability per occurrence in the amount of \$500,000 single limit to include: owned, hired, and non-owned.
 - 3. Commercial General Liability in the amount of \$1,000,000 combined single limit to include:

Premises Operations Products and Completed Operations Blanket Contractual Broad Form Property Damage Independent Contractors Personal Injury

The Commercial General Liability policy, if written on a "claims made basis," must have a two (2) year tail of coverage, or an unbroken continuation of coverage for two (2) years, from the completion of the contract requirements.

- C. Each policy of insurance required by this section shall provide for advance notice to IAM prior to cancellation in accordance with the policy. If the insurer does not notify IAM upon policy cancellation, it shall be Contractors' responsibility to notify IAM of such cancellation.
- D. With the exception of Worker's Compensation, each policy shall name IAM as an "Additional Insured" and the actual policy endorsement shall accompany each Certificate of Insurance.
- E. General Liability and Automobile policies shall be endorsed to waive all rights of subrogation against IAM by reason of any payment made for claims

under the above coverage. This policy endorsement shall accompany each Certificate of Insurance.

Section 7. Liability.

Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold IAM harmless from any and all claims, lawsuits or liability, including attorney fees and costs, arising out of or related to any wrongful or negligent act, error or omission of Contractor in its performance of this contract.

Section 8. Ownership; Publication, Reproduction and Use of Material.

Except as otherwise provided herein, all data, documents and materials produced by Contractor under this contract shall be the property of IAM, which shall retain the exclusive right to publish, disclose, distribute and otherwise use, in whole or in part, any such data, documents or other materials. Exclusive rights shall not be attributed to portions of such materials presently in the public domain or which are not subject to copyright.

Section 9. Inspection and Retention of Records.

Contractor shall, at any time during normal business hours and as often as IAM may deem necessary, make available to IAM, for examination, all of its records with respect to all matters covered by this contract for a period ending three (3) years after expiration or earlier termination of this contract. Upon request, and within a reasonable time, Contractor shall submit such information and reports relating to its activities under this contract to IAM, in such form and at such times as IAM may reasonably require. Contractor shall permit IAM to audit, examine and make copies of such records, and to make audits of all invoices, materials, payrolls, records of personnel and other data relating to matters covered by this contract. IAM may, at its option, permit Contractor to submit its records to IAM in lieu of the retention requirements of this section.

Section 10. Notices.

Any notice required pertaining to this contract shall be either sent via e-mail or facsimile (FAX) or mailed by prepaid first class registered or certified mail, return receipt requested to the following addresses:

Notices are effective upon the earlier of receipt, proof of good transmission (facsimiles only), or five (5) days after proof of proper posting.

PART II

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. Relationship of Parties.

Contractor shall perform its obligations hereunder as an independent contractor of IAM. IAM may administer the contract and monitor Contractor's compliance with its obligations hereunder. IAM shall not supervise or direct Contractor other than as provided in this section.

Section 2. Permits, Laws and Taxes.

Contractor shall acquire and maintain in good standing all permits, licenses and other entitlements necessary to its performance under this contract. All actions taken by Contractor under this contract shall comply with all applicable statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations. Contractor shall pay all taxes pertaining to its performance under this contract.

Section 3. Assignments.

Unless otherwise allowed by this contract or in writing by IAM, any assignment by Contractor of its interest in any part of this contract or any delegation of duties under this contract shall be void, and an attempt by Contractor to assign any part of its interest or delegate duties under this contract shall give IAM the right immediately to terminate this contract without any liability for work performed.

Section 4. Nonwaiver.

The failure of either Party at any time to enforce a provision of this contract shall in no way constitute a waiver of the provision, nor in any way affect the validity of this contract or any part hereof, or the right of such Party thereafter to enforce each and every provision hereof.

Section 5. Jurisdiction; Choice of Law.

Any civil action rising from this contract shall be brought in the Superior Court for the Third Judicial District of the State of Alaska, at Anchorage. The law of the State of Alaska, without regard to its conflicts of law, shall govern the rights and obligations of the Parties under this contract.

Section 6. Severability.

Any provision of this contract decreed invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction shall not invalidate the remaining provisions of the contract.

Section 7. Integration.

This instrument and all appendices and amendments hereto embody the entire agreement of the Parties. There are no promises, terms, conditions or obligations other than those contained herein, and this contract shall supersede all previous communications, representations or agreements, either oral or written, between the Parties hereto.

Section 8. Amendment.

- A. This contract shall only be amended, modified or changed by a writing, executed by authorized representatives of the Parties with the same formality as this contract was executed.
- B. For the purposes of any amendment, modification or change to the terms and conditions of this contract, the only authorized representatives of the Parties are:

Contractor: Stated Clerk

C. Any attempt to amend, modify, or change this contract by either an unauthorized representative or unauthorized means shall be void.

Section 9. Execution in Counterparts.

This contract may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

Section 10. Transmission of Documents.

This contract and signed documents produced under this contract may be sent electronically, and such electronically transmitted documents shall be considered

an original document and shall have the same effect and enforceability under law as a document having an original signature.

Section 11. Binding Effect.

This contract is binding upon and inures to the benefit of the Parties, their successors and permitted assigns.
