The Presbyterian Youth Triennium is a conference for youth from the PC(USA) and Cumberland Presbyterian Church. It is held every three years at Purdue University (Indianapolis, IN). Through worship, small groups, recreational events and mission experiences the goal is to inspire youth and adults to be disciples into today's world. Who Can Attend?

- Youth (current 8th - 12th graders) who are actively involved in a PC(USA) congregation
- Adult advisors (chaperones for the youth from our delegation)
- College-age staff (serve on work crew to support the Triennium)
- Small group leaders (adults 23 years and older who lead small group gatherings)

Costs: \$1450 per youth participant

Each church will need to work with their youth participants in determining what is paid by the participant and the church. Scholarships are available to help if a church or congregation is not able to pay the entire \$1450. In the past individuals or churches have received money from civic groups or native corporations through youth empowerment (or similar names) funds.

Airline tickets (roundtrip from village to Anchorage) for up to two village youth participants per church would be paid by the Yukon Presbytery. If additional travel grants are secured or airline ticket prices go down participants will be notified.

2019 Russia Mission Network Conference

For those of you who might have missed Ellen's letters during the holiday season, please note the following plans for the 2019 Russia Mission Network Conference.

"For those of you awaiting more information on the Russian Mission Network for 2019, we finally have dates. The RMN will gather in Smolensk, Russia (this will be the first time that we have gathered in Russia) from September 20-22, 2019. The plan is to offer travel options for those interested either before or after the Smolensk gathering. Some may want to visit their partner churches, but the RMN is not limited to people involved in congregational partnerships. Our current thought is to organize a visit to Davydovo, Butovo (one of the killing fields of Soviet times - just outside of Moscow) and possibly Vladimir and Suzdal - two of the great Golden Ring cities. Please let us know if you have any interest. This is an extraordinary opportunity to hear more from our Russian partners and to get another, broader view of ministry in Russia, as well as a bit more of the history."
